



INCLEMENT WEATHER CLOSING

CCLS remains open and observes its schedules in all weather, unless the determination is made by the President, Vice President or School Director that current weather conditions warrant cancellation of classes and/or temporary school closing. In the event of extreme weather emergency conditions such as a hurricane watch or warning, CCLS will cancel classes and instructions will be communicated to employees and students via telephone and/or email.

If weather deteriorates unexpectedly, students and employees are advised to listen to/watch for official advisories/alerts:

3. Local TV and radio stations
4. CCLS website will inform on school activities during and after a hurricane or other extreme weather condition

Unless there is an announcement to the contrary, classes and office hours will resume at the usual time on the following day of the event, assuming the hurricane watch/warning has been lifted and the school has not suffered damages. Cancelled classes will be made up and the session end date postponed.

In the event of a hurricane, tornado, flood or other inclement weather conditions, students are strongly advised to:

1. Be prepared. Buy supplies, water, batteries well in advance of the storm
2. Stay informed – listen to/watch for advisories and alerts via Internet, TV or radio
3. Stay indoors until it is safe to be outside
4. Obey evacuation instructions. Seek a shelter closest to your home. Instructions will be communicated and a bus will take you to the nearest shelter
5. Not underestimate the forces of nature and venture outside before, during or immediately after the storm. Wait until there is official advisory that the storm has passed
6. Advise CCLS via Internet or telephone if you plan to travel away from the hurricane path
7. Contact the school as soon as possible after the storm to let us know where/how you are. We will inform when the school will resume regular hours of operation.
